Abacus

Abacus will begin this month. I am already excited about this new addition to our programs. It is important that school age children (4 years and older) come to school on time. 8.00am is when class begins. Children will need to have their abacus in order to be in class.

Books

Books and Stationary for this academic year is as follows
Primary 1 to 6 is 1500
KG 1 is 650
KG2 is 700
Pre School is not ready yet.

Operation Hours

I wish to remind parents that start time is 8.00 am. Closing time for regular day care hours (children 0-3years) is 5.00pm.

Children of school going age (4 years and older) start class at 8.00am and closing time is 3.30pm.

After school activities begin at 3.30pm. If your child is not in any after school activity, pick up time is 3.30pm. Consideration is given to children who have younger siblings in preschool. Pick up any time after 5.00pm attracts a late fee.

In this new school year, lateness will not be allowed. Children four years and older begin class at 8.00am. By 8.30am first class is over.

School Fees

School fees is due monthly by the third day of the current month. Fees not received by the 3rd will result in refusal to accept the child unless prior arrangements have been made. This will be strictly enforced.

PTA dues is 120 a year.

The School year book is 120 cedis a copy.

Sick child policy

Please be reminded that sick children have to stay home so that we don't infect other children in school. When a child has a fever, please make sure the child is home fever free 24hours before returning to school.
